Chapter 24 CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

Section 24.01 Purpose

The purpose of this Chapter shall be to establish the position of Code Enforcement Officer and to designate the responsibilities for such office and to relate them to other provisions of this Code.

Section 24.02 Appointment

The City Council shall appoint a person to act as the appointed Code Enforcement Officer.

Section 24.03 Powers and Duties

A Code Enforcement Officer is authorized and directed to enforce the Municipal Code of the City of Rolfe, Iowa. A Code Enforcement Officer has the power and authority to issue citations and court summons due to violations of the Municipal Code of the City of Rolfe, Iowa.

The Code Enforcement Officer shall be considered an authorized municipal officer as stated in the Municipal Code of the City of Rolfe, Iowa.

A Code Enforcement Officer shall also perform such other duties as may be prescribed for him/her by the Mayor.

Section 24.04 Designated Alternates

The Mayor, as the supervisor of the Code Enforcement Officer, is hereby authorized to act as Code Enforcement Officer in case of his/her absence or unavailability.

The City Clerk and full time City Maintenance Workers are authorized to act as a Code Enforcement Officer

Section 24.05 Prohibited Activity

The Code Enforcement Officer shall not engage, directly or indirectly, in the sale, furnishing, installation or maintenance of building materials, plumbing supplies, electrical or mechanical equipment or weed control agents, nor shall he/she have a financial interest in any concern engaged in such business in the City.

Section 24.06 Compensation

The appointed Code Enforcement Officer shall have compensation set by resolution of the council.

REPEALER: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: If any section, provision or part of the Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

WHEN EFFECTIVE: This Ordinance shall be in affect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.


